FROM THE PASTOR

Grace and peace be unto you from God, our Father and our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

We, unworthy and yet forgiven people. We, who tend at times toward needing a break...just kicking back on the couch and relaxing. Yet, we must be reminded that while there is time to couch...there is also time to get off the couch as well. "To everything there is a season (Ecc 3:1)", right? ☺ And all too soon after 1999 did my Cleveland Browns find that out as well. (But that's...another story. A long, sad Browns fan story.) Before I digress too much, let's hear God out again about how we are given faith and when the time is to get off the couch. Right from the Savior's mouth:

Jesus said:

"Stand up. Take your couch and go..." + Matt 9:6

"Stand up, take your couch and go..." + Mark 2:11

"I say to you – stand up and take your couch and go..." + Luke 5:24

"Stand up, take your couch and walk." + John 5:8

As we know, there is a tendency on occasion to desire to sit back and simply "let others do it". There are also thoughts along the same lines like:

"I've done it enough, someone else can handle it."; "Why don't you contact so-and-so"; Why don't you contact and encourage the others...I can even let you know when they are home."; "The youth/younger generation need to step up or else there isn't going to be a church anymore."

These are some true-to-life words and phrases we all hear all too often. When we (you and I) state a phrase like that and project the faithful action onto the other: "YOU know what YOU should do..." But, where does that end? Where does the buck stop? Does it stop with the Pastor, or the church building's office staff, or

the Council, or a Committee, or? If the buck keeps getting passed...then everyone just ends up broke(n). Leaders in the Church are merely aiding the rest of the Church in our leadership together in faith. As Christians, we are all called to be a leader off the couch in various ways.

To put it to a more modern pop culture verse (from "High School Musical: The Musical" even...)

"Everyone is special in their own way. We make each other strong. Together's where we belong.

We're all in this together. Once we know that we are, we're all stars and we see that

We're all in this together, and it shows when we stand hand in hand..."

I can't believe I just quoted that musical. Sheesh. Yet, it's poignant. Hand in hand with one another. Hand in hand with our Lord and Savior. Hand in hand with the Holy Spirit guiding. Hand in hand with our Creator. I could direct you to a longer reading, that of Hebrews 11:1-40. Read that one. Talk about faith and being called to action... Every single one of those individuals and groups that felt, and were gifted their understanding of faith, rose to the occasion and stepped forth. At one point, perhaps on the couch... yet now called to action. That call leads us directly to Hebrews 12:1 where we are called to "run the race".

Our couch is a comfortable place. I know that once I sit or lay back on it that each time I go to get up, part of me is really desiring to not do so. To lay back down and say "Meh. I can do that later." And there IS a time to rest – don't get me wrong there. Rest and well-being are important. Yet, we also need to hear and be reminded of our call to action in faith. After all, what is faith if it is not shared with others? Just as in Hebrews 11:1-40. Faith was given and action was then taken, not paused on. Again and again: with Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, people of

Israel, the army around Jericho, Rahab, Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, David, Samuel, the prophets... FAITH calls Christians to action. Faith is a catalyst for faithful action/reaction. Especially in these past few years, it has become difficult at times to get that faith-filled action going and get up off the couch. Church services are offered not only in person but online and on the radio. Meetings are offered via Zoom and other kinds of teleconferences. I.T. and electronics in modern-day give us such wonderful "conveniences" and simple ways of connection. Yet, we cannot allow that to remove or interfere with our call to action and to community, and to service to others – visual and actual manifestations of faith received and responded to.

Yes, many need those online connections (Homebound, those in care facilities, the immuno-compromised, etc.). Yet, when possible...we are called to BE...to be present with others. Online worship works to a point. We can't properly commune together online. We can't be present sitting/standing/singing/reciting with one another in the same space – glancing around us as we are gathered together (a tighter, stronger, more intimate feeling of God's presence with us all as one). So when possible, God says "gather".

Yes, there are things that separate us such as wanting to keep ourselves and our neighbors safe, and healthy, and well during and through the other side of a pandemic. So we are called to do what we can, and we are called to creative ways to reach out...perhaps still at a distance, yet off the couch.

"Getting off the couch" is similar in phrase and understanding to "Nothing good happens after midnight". It can catch us off our feet because we have a nature that is desirous of comfort and

selfishness (thanks be to God for God's promise to forgive that). We must hear faith's purpose for us each, and be watchful and not fall into those desires and concerns such as in 2 Timothy 3:1-9. In Christ, we are called to beware of our own desires of comfort and to quash that which is not healthy and well...to lift positively up our Savior's voice: hear and heed God's call to run the race and to put faith into action.

After all, there isn't such a thing as a Couch Christian, anyway.

So, take time needed for safety and wellness. Keep that positive action within community spaces as well. Yet, also take up your couch and go to others as the time is needed. Lift up future leaders by making the calls and invites, not leaving it to others. Check in with one another. After all, multiple points of contact and invite have that much more of an impact over just one, right? As we are called: Be Church. Be Church together. The time and place is now.





There will be shovels, salt or sand at each entrance. A sign-up sheet is located in the Fellowship Hall.

WHY SOCKS AND UNDERWEAR!?





for the Month of March

First Sunday in Lent March 6, 2022

These forty days called Lent are like no other. It is our opportune time to return to the God who rescues, to receive the gifts of God's grace, to believe with the heart and confess with the mouth the wonder of God's love in Jesus, and to resist temptation at every turn. This is no small pilgrimage on which we have just embarked. It is a struggle Jesus knew. It is a struggle Jesus shares. The nearness of the Lord, in bread and wine, water and word, will uphold and sustain us.

Second Sunday in Lent March 13, 2022

Though we sometimes doubt and often resist God's desire to protect and save us, our God persists. In holy baptism, God's people have been called and gathered into a God-initiated relationship that will endure. Lent provides the church with a time and a tradition in which to seek God's face again. Lent provides another occasion to behold the God of our salvation in the face of the Blessed One who "comes in the name of the Lord."

**Third Sunday in Lent
March 20, 2022**

The warnings are plentiful and blunt on the third Sunday in Lent. Cut it out or get cut down! The warnings are accompanied by God's invitation to attentiveness: "Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live." The landowner's ultimatum is forestalled by the gardener's readiness to till the ground one more year. That is good news for all of us. Thanks be to God!

**Fourth Sunday in Lent
March 27, 2022**

The psalm sets the tone this day: "Happy are they whose transgressions are forgiven, and whose sin is put away!" Happy are those who have "become the righteousness of God" in the merits of Christ Jesus. Happy are those for whom the forgiveness of God has "rolled away . . . the disgrace" of former times. Happy is the father at the return of his prodigal son. Happy are we that our sins are forgiven for Jesus' sake. Rejoice!
