April showers and a bear, bring May ____???

As I write to you, some light April showers pitter outside. My window is open as I work from home due to Chassell Schools using the building for student testing. I'm hearing the light patter of the rain, occasional small breezes blowing through, and the traffic back on the highway. The woods seems oddly quiet. Then my phone dings. It's Janey Sargent messaging me that there is a black bear sighting in the back woods behind the parsonage. So, I get up from my dining room chair at the table to look, yet I can't see anything resembling a bear silhouette. I'm not frightened. Perhaps eager though and am hoping to catch a glimpse of it, while recalling last year's bear in the woods that climbed and hung out at the top of a huge mother tree in the back for a while...and even came up on the back porch to sniff around. That's the only thing I don't want right now. I mean, it

was cool to see it with the kids last year as we were safely in the house, observing from the kitchen door. Yet currently, I just began boiling down all the maple sap I have collected...and I would rather the bear keep its distance, than steal away some of my pots and jugs for its own. So, I casually keep looking up from my laptop screen surveying the woods. I haven't put my bird feed out yet, either...because that's been removed in the past by the bear as well.

I marvel at these woods, and thoroughly enjoy watching the wildlife (bear, cougar, bobcat, fox, wolf, coyote, racoons, rabbits, skunks, squirrels, chipmunks and so many bird varieties) and doing some beautiful foraging myself in there when the time comes for various things: chanterelles, black trumpets, boletes, turkey tail, oyster mushrooms, spruce tips, rose hips, ghost pipe, raspberries, black berries, thimbleberries, partridge berries, winter berries, apples, wild oregano, ramps, fiddleheads, trout lilies, etc.

The bear must have kept strolling now as I hear the woods come back to life with sounds of the pileated woodpecker banging away, the Raven announcing the "all clear", and smaller birds begin chirping and fluttering about.

And currently, as I write, it is only early/mid April. What will all this bring to our month of May? I hope to see the fox near its den soon.

God of all creation – we marvel and are in awe of this gift of life you provide, and the gift of allowing us to recognize such amazing wonders. Instill in us this love and care of our surroundings and give us your lung-filling breath of the Holy Spirit to dwell with us in it all. Let us be inspired and tune our ears to hear your directions each and every day of breath you give us. We pray all this through your son, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Get out. Take and make the time and breathe deeply in God's creation and give thanks. Bring others out for the stroll, the forage, the hike, the sightseeing. Silently surround yourself and be immersed in the supporting sounds of the sweet singing of abundant life.

Be inspired. Be in awe of our great God.

Sixth Sunday of Easter May 5, 2024

This Sunday's image of the life the risen Christ shares with us is the image of friendship. We are called to serve others as Jesus came to serve; but for John's gospel, the image of servanthood is too hierarchical, too distant, to capture the essence of life with Christ. Friendship captures the love, the joy, the deep mutuality of the relationship into which Christ invites us. The Greeks believed that true friends are willing to die for each other. This is the mutual love of Christian community commanded by Christ and enabled by the Spirit.

Seventh Sunday of Easter May 12, 2024

The gospel for Easter's seventh Sunday is always taken from the long prayer Jesus prays for his followers in John's gospel on the night before his death, and always includes Jesus' desire that his followers will be one as he and the Father are one. This oneness is not mere doctrinal agreement or institutional unity, but mutual abiding, interpenetrating life, mutual love, and joy. This oneness is the work of the Spirit whom we have received but also await. Come, Holy Spirit!

PRAYER OF THE DAY

O God, you have prepared for those who love you joys beyond understanding. Pour into our hearts such love for you that, loving you above all things, we may obtain your promises, which exceed all we can desire; through Jesus Christ, your Son and our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

First Reading: Acts 10:44-48 Psalm Reading: Psalm 98 Second Reading: 1 John 5:1-6 Gospel Reading: John 15:9-17

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Gracious and glorious God, you have chosen us as your own, and by the powerful name of Christ you protect us from evil. Day of Pentecost May 19, 2024

Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Crossing all boundaries that would separate us, the Spirit brings the wideness of God's mercy to places we least expect it—to a crowd of strangers of different lands and tongues, to dry bones, to our weak hearts. Jesus promises his disciples that they will be accompanied by the Holy Spirit, and that this Spirit reveals the truth. We celebrate that we too have been visited with this same Spirit. Guided by the truth, we join together in worship, and then disperse to share the fullness of Christ's love with the world.

The Holy Trinity May 26, 2024

When we say God is the triune God, we are saying something about who God is beyond, before, and after the universe: that there is community within God. Our experience of this is reflected in Paul's words today. When we pray to God as Jesus prayed to his Abba (an everyday, intimate parental address), the Spirit prays within us, creating between us and God the same relationship Jesus has with the one who sent him.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

God, our provider, help us. It is hard to believe there is enough to share. We question your ways when they differ from the ways of the world in which we live. We turn to our own understanding rather than trusting in you. We take offense at your teachings and your ways. Turn us again to you. Where else can we turn? Share with us the worlds of eternal life and feed us for life in the world. Amen.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Mighty God, you breathe life into our bones, and your Spirit brings truth to the world. Send us this Spirit, transform us by your truth, and give us language to proclaim your gospel, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen

Second Reading: Romans 8:22-27
